This funding will be used to

- Continue implementation of Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) across the entire school.
- Embed the “Write that Essay” writing program across the school to increase writing results in NAPLAN, and to increase A-C results in English to 75% by the end of Semester 1, and to 78% by the end of the year.
- Sustain the percentage of year 12 students attaining a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) or Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA) at 100% in 2021.
- Support the academic engagement of students in the senior school, through the provision of laptop devices.
- Support the implementation of the Key Improvement Strategies from the 12 month action plan, as a result of the priority school review.
- Encourage positive parent and community engagement through the provision of software to effectively manage student attendance and engagement.
- Celebrate student success in reaching achievement and attendance targets, creating a culture that promotes learning.

Our initiatives include

- Supporting student engagement and achievement by providing specialised support services and staff to engage students and ensure every child succeeds.
- Supporting the implementation of PBL across the school to create a safe, supportive, inclusive environment for all students, in line with the Student Code of Conduct, and the student discipline procedure.
- Providing additional certification courses to our year 12 students to ensure every child leaves school with a Queensland Certificate of Education or a QCIA.
- Engaging parents and caregivers as partners in learning, through the implementation of software, to enhance and support positive student engagement.
- Developing and enhancing the leadership capabilities of the leadership team to ensure every child succeeds.



Continuing to support PBL in order to maintain high fidelity (75% TFI) implementation.	\$15 000
Embedding the whole school writing program "Write that Essay" to enhance writing skills of all our students, and ensure teachers and students engage with the online tool to enhance writing skills.	\$8 000
Fund a fifth Deputy Principal position to ensure a deliberate focus on improving student attendance, achievement and wellbeing.	\$149 000
Celebrate student success in reaching academic and engagement targets and milestones, while enhancing student engagement.	\$14 000
Purchasing and using a software communication and absence management tool to assist in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - parent and community engagement - parent communication - student engagement and attendance 	\$19 000
Enhancing student outcomes through the development of specific action plans in the areas of: culture and capability, senior performance and outcomes, junior pathways, curriculum and pedagogy, inclusion and wellbeing.	\$75 000
Providing support for our mobile platform of student hired devices, specifically aimed at senior students, to ensure equitable student access to Information and Communication Technology (ICT) skills necessary for 21 st century learning.	\$224 374
