- Support every student to exit with a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) and/or Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA) through targeted interventions and supports such as specialist staff to track attendance and engagement and digital learning.
- Continue to support the literacy proficiency of students by accessing and embedding the whole school writing program "Write that Essay" to enhance the writing skills of all our students, and support the continued capability development of teachers.
- Support the attendance, achievement and wellbeing of students and continue to drive our school improvement agenda through the employment of an additional Deputy Principal.
- Sustain the percentage of year 12 students attaining a QCE or Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA) at 100% in 2022.
- Support the implementation of the Explicit Improvement Agenda, Annual Implementation Plan and Strategic plan through targeted professional learning plans that focus on High Performing Teams, Universal Design for Learning and Essential Skills for Classroom Management.
- Enhance staff capability to provide differentiated teaching and learning practices to support the engagement of all students.
- Create release time for teaching teams to collaboratively plan and implement targeted pedagogical approaches and interventions to support growth in student learning.
- Celebrate student success in reaching achievement and attendance targets, creating a culture that promotes learning.
